## 1.b. MULTIDRUG-RESISTANT TUBERCULOSIS

This project is being carried out to decrease mortality and morbidity due to Tuberculosis and cut transmission of infection until TB Ceases to be a major health problem.

We are taking this task of treating TB since 2012 with the financial support of **City of Hope and Joy Foundation.** 

## **Activities:**

- Try to achieve and maintain cure rate of at least 75% amongst new sputum positive cases.
- Try to detect at least 50% of new sputum positive (PTB) cases among the people in the operational area.
- Try to motivate and refer the suspected to undergo tests and take treatment (drugs) without slack at least for sixmonths.
- Try to improve their health status / immune power to resist side effects through supply of nutritious diets.
- Try to support for the education of the children of the TB infected and affected to reduce dropout and child labour rate.

# 1.c. COMMUNITY BASED HEALTH CENTRES

Since the year 1981 the TMSSS is running four Health Centres at Manjampatty, Malaipatty, Avarampatty and Chinnandipatty to alleviate the immediate sufferings of the rural poor and the less privileged without any discrimination on the basis of Caste, religion, language, colour etc. All the patients who approach the Health Centres are given free consultation, free medicines and drugs. Only for deliveries a normal fee is being collected.

This programme is being run purely on charity basis because no funds and grants are being solicited from any source.

In addition to the extension of the required medical services in the centres the patients who need specialized treatment and care are referred to other established hospitals with whom the TMSSS have developed good and tie-up. The TMSSS referred patients are treated at concessional rate in all the tie-up hospitals.

# 1.d. INTEGRATED REHABILITATION CENTRE FOR ADDICTS (IRCA)

Alcoholics are those excessive drinkers whose dependence upon alcohol has attained such a degree that it shows an interference with their bodily and mental health, their interpersonal relations and their smooth social and economic functioning.

Since alcohol abuse is on the increase year by year, Tiruchirapalli Multipurpose Social Service Society come to the rescue of persons addicted to alcohol from the year 1993 through an Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for addicts established at keeranur with 15 beds under the grant-in-aid of the Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment.

## **Activities**

- Try to increase the public awareness regarding the hazards of drugs / alcohol addiction through outreach programmes.
- Try to prevent people from becoming addicts and victims to alcohol and other drugs.
- Try to rehabilitate alcohol / drug addicts and restore them to normal life and
- Try to provide social, psychological and economic support to the families of the addicts.

# 2. EDUCATIONAL AND SPORTS ACTIVITIES

# 2.a. DAY CARE CENTRES (CRECHES)

Since the year 1980-81 Day Care Centres are being run by TMSSS under Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme. The programme that started with 2 centres have now grown to 16 centres catering to the day care needs of around 425 children of 01 to 06 age group. The programme is being financially supported with the grant-in-aid by the Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi under the Ministry of Women and Child Development.

A crèche is a facility which enables parents to leave their children while they are at work and where children are provided stimulating environment for their holistic development. Creches are designed to provide group care to children, usually upto 6 years of age, who need care, guidance and supervision away from their home during the day.

#### These creches aim to:

- To provide day care facilities for children (6 months to 6 years) of working mothers in the community.
- To improve nutrition and health status of children
- To promote physical, cognitive, social and emotional development (Holistic Development) of children.
- To educate and empower parents / caregivers for better childcare.

## 2.d. AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMME FOR SLUM CHILDREN

Slum children are totally deprived of a conducive atmosphere for learning. Their parents since mostly illiterate are not able to assist their children in education. Lack of proper guidance and supplementary education leads the children to poor performance which deteriorates their interest in learning. It gradually causes drop out of children from schools.

Therefore TMSSS to help the school going and dropout children in slums started this After School Programme with the financial assistance of Fundacion Maria Francisca ROVIRALTA. 15 such centres are running in Tiruchy slums.

Summer Courses are organized by TMSSS on a regular basis to help children to proficiently in language and to learn extra skills like computer operation, tailoring etc., This helps students to spend the holidays on a useful manner.

# 3. REHABILITATION PROGRAMMES

## 3.a. TMSSS - NAMBIKKAIYAGAM

In the year 2008 the Government of Tamilnadu initiated a project of special vocational centre with residential facilities for the persons from 14 to 25 years of age with mental retardation and associated conditions. This project is being implemented by TMSSS with the grant - in-aid of the commissionarate of the Welfare of the Alternatively Abled, Chennai. The main thrust of the programme is to identify and develop the hidden vocational skills so as to enable the MR adult's access to livelihood security. There are, at present 46 persons in Nambikkaiyagam (26 males and 20 females).

## **Major Aims and Objectives**

- > To provide education and training to the mentally handicapped adults
- > To provide composite care and suitable vocational training to mentally challenged
- > To enhance the employability of the mentally challenged.
- To improve the socialization process and acceptance
- ➤ To emphasize the responsibility of parents and the extended families through counselling and motivation.
- > To undertake and encourage scientific research works related to prevention of mental retardation.
- > To develope public awareness on mental retardation.

## key services delivered

#### 1. Health Care and Nutrition

Nambikkaiyagam provides delicious and nutritious food to the students. The diet is well planned and properly prepared to supplement the health requirement of the students. The home maintains the following minimum standards of service with regard to health and medical care.

- Regular visit by the general physician and psychiatrist
- Maintenance of individual health record
- Regular medical checkups and proper medication
- Updating of health records
- Record of menstrual cycle of the female MR students.
- Assessment formats and other administration records.

#### 2. Vocational Training

Vocational training is highly helpful to the MR adults to reach the goals of social and economical security for a peaceful and productive living. Therefore, the institute conducts a series of vocational courses that develop occupational skills in the inmates. The capacity and interest of each student is personally

assessed by the staff members, academically qualified and experienced in vocational training. Based on the assessment, the skill development training is offered. Some of the vocational skills imparted to the students are as follows:

## 3.b. SHORT STAY HOME FOR STRANDED WOMEN AND GIRLS

Sontham is one of the several units of TMSSS established during the year 1993 with the grant- in aid of the CSWB, New Delhi to care stranded women and children for short duration and to rehabilitate them in mainstream of life. The home provides temporary shelter for girls, women and children in precarious conditions before and after marriage and also for those who runaway from homes due to various reasons.

The girls and women admitted in the home are referred by different departments of the Government and other NGO's. They are guided to solve their problems and difficulties through counselling. The girls, women and children so admitted are being provided food, accommodation, health care and recreational facilities

# 3.c. SONTHAM - INTEGRATED PROGRAMME FOR STREET CHILDREN (OPEN SHELTER)

In keeping with our vision of a just society and commitment to the empowerment of people towards human dignity, we had turned to the plight of street children and started this project of rehabilitation in 1994. Our mission is to educate and aspire for an integral development of the deprived children of the streets of Tiruchirapalli Corporation. Here is a report on the measures taken during the period from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2015 to 31<sup>st</sup> March of 2016. TMSSS-SONTHAM (Rehabilitation Home for Street children) is implementing two projects viz Open shelter, and Children Reception Unit for providing temporary care and protection. These programmes are sponsored by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Department of Social Defense, New Delhi. 10% of the cost being met by TMSSS.

## 3.d. INFANT JESUS DAY CARE CENTRE FOR MR CHILDREN

It is very unfortunate to note that Children with disabilities are considered to be burdensome by their family members. There are many factors responsible for this situation. In our observation, we were able track that the practical, psychological, and physical support of the families for the disabled child is minimum or nil.

Considering the various needs of the large number of disabled TMSSS has decided to meet the challenges of assisting this group of needy disabled through a well structured IBR (Institutional Based Rehabilitation) Plan.

Hence **Infant Jesus Day Care Centre for MR Children** was started during the year 1997 and it is still being continued by TMSSS with the financial support of Stitching Liliane Fonds – The Netherlands. During this year 2015-16 15 MR children were cared for

#### 3.e. COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION

Community Based Rehabilitation (CBR) focuses on enhancing the quality of life for people with disabilities and their families, meeting their basic needs and ensuring their involvement and participation. **CBR is a multi-sectoral approach and has 5 major components:** *Health, Education, Livelihood, Social and Empowerment.* CBR is a strategy for rehabilitation, equalization of opportunity, poverty reduction and social inclusion of people with disabilities.

## Aim of the project:

Empowering Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) by eliminating social discrimination and building capacities to access socio-cultural and economic resources and support so as to lead a life with human dignity and self respect.

## **Specific Objectives:**

- 1. To inculcate treatment seeking behaviour like PT, OT, Spl. Edu. and Social skills among the PWDs through assessing the extent and type of the disability.
- 2. To sensitize the rural communities on the prevention aspects of disabilities through awareness generation.
- 3. To bring a change in the attitude and behaviours of school students in understanding and treating the students and persons with disabilities.
- 4. To organize the persons with Disabilities into Self Help Groups for enhancing their bargaining capacity and ensuring their rights and entitlements.
- 5. To increase their employability and ensure livelihood security through skill development and access to financial resources.

6. To offer / promote linkages and referral services to enable the disabled to avail the existing services from the Government, Quasi - Government and other Private Institutions for their betterment and future sustainability.

## 3.f. ARTIFICIAL LIMBS FITMENT CENTRE

The disabled persons face a lot of problems from cradle to grave. One crucial challenge placed before them is the restriction of their mobility. As a result, the opportunities for leading functionally productive lives are very much restricted. Moreover, many of them come from low-income or very poor and marginalized families. But the application of modern technology, have helped to emerge a number of aids and appliances that can reduce the effects of disabilities and enhance the economic benefits of these appliances because of their inability to find funds to purchase them.

Under this circumstance, the Government of India has been providing aids and appliances to the disabled persons at minimum costs. This scheme is known as ADIP scheme. It aims at helping the disabled persons by bringing suitable, durable, scientifically – manufactured, modern, standard aids and appliances within their reach.. The Artificial Limbs Fitment Centre at Sangliandapuram was started in 1989 mainly for the implementation of this scheme. It has been manufacturing calipers shoes and prosthesis for the people with physical disabilities. The Physically challenged people are identified through camps, in collaboration with the District Differently Abled Welfare Officers (DDAWOs) of 4 districts in Tamilnadu and the different units of TMSSS. Since 1994the centre has been getting the financial support from the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, New Delhi.









# 3.g. PHYSIOTHERAPY TREATMENT CENTRE

The Physiotherapy Centre of TMSSS is functioning at Sangliyandapuram, Trichy from 1989 by employing qualified Physiotherapist and Occupational therapist. The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, New Delhi approved this programme for grant in aid from 1st March 2000. PWDs and poor people are benefited through this programme.

The patients treated here are followed up regularly and frequent reviews are made on their improvement.

Apart from our outpatient and inpatient services we also extend our treatment even at the door steps through field visits of the PWDs who are unable to come to the centre

During the year 2015 - 16 in total 7754 PWDs both outpatients and at outreach were given free treatment by this unit. It is anticipated that around 8000 patients will be benefited through our treatment centre during the year 2016-2017.

# 3.h. SONTHAM BINDING UNIT

The Note Books Production and Binding unit at V.N. Nagar (near Chathiram Bus Terminal) Trichy was first established by TMSSS on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2004 with a major aim to equip the street children brought under the care with some production skills, to provide employment and income opportunities and thereby to enable them to become self dependant and masters of their own destinies.

## 4. AGRICULTURAL & ENVIRONMENTAL PROGRAMMES

## 4.a. DELAYED MAKETING CENTRES

The TMSSS runs three Delayed Marketing Centres at a) keeranur from 1993, b) Manaparai from 1994 and c) Nazareth from 1998 to support the small and marginal farmers of the respective areas without any discrimination on the basic caste and religion.

When the farmers sell their products immediately after harvest they will not get any profit and many a time not even the invested amount because the price will be very low due to more supply. Therefore, the socioeconomic living conditions of such farmers are always stagnant and they are, therefore, forced to borrow from the money lenders to meet their emergent and extra needs and fall into their clutches. To help and relieve such poor small and marginal farmers, TMSSS provides them godown facilities in those three places. They are assisted to store their products at the payment of nominal rent say at 20 Paisa per 100 kilogram of the produce. They will take out the products when the prices go high and sell it and pay their rent from their sale proceeds. For their families immediate needs Rs. 10,000/- per farmer is given as loan at 8% interest which they will repay after they sell their produces. The rent and interest collected from the farmers are spent only to maintain the godowns and to pay honorarium to the care takers or persons in-charges.

## **Basic objectives of running these Delayed Marketing Centres:**

- \* To eliminate the exploitation of middlemen, traders and money lenders
- \* To enable the poor farmers get fair and competitive price for their products.
- \* To facilitate the farmers to play due role in fixing up the prices for their products.
- \* To help the farmers to keep their products in a safe and secured place until they are able to sell at reasonable price.
- \* To orient and encourage the farmers to have direct linkages with marketing firms / agencies and thereby minimize middlemen intervention and exploitation.

## 4.b. PARTICIPATION IN PRIME MINISTER'S SWATCH BHARATH MISSION

On the basis of Prime Minister's Swatch Bharath Mission, TMSSS Kolping India Program also planned to give awareness on Health and Sanitation particularly in rural areas and also motivate the poor and needy families to construct toilets and to be free from open defecation. Kloping movement conducted 2 Awareness programs and 2 Training programs to the Kolping group members based on health and sanitation. On the eve of World Toilet Day, we have conducted a Mass Rally and Public Awareness Program to give awareness on Health and Hygiene. Government Officials, Doctors, NGO reparesentatives, Councilors, Village Leaders, School Teachers, School students and Kolping Group members participated in the rally. Through this scheme we have given financial assistance of Rs. 1,50,000 to 10 families to construct toilets with the financial assistance of 15,000 each with a subsidy of 5000. The attempt to contribute our share to the Prime Minister's mission have been welcomed by many and our efforts will continue in the future

#### 4.c. PROTECTION AND PRESERVATION OF NATURAL ENVIRONMENT

TMSSS organizes programmes and executes projects to protect the Environment and promote livelihood stability of the target people in Trichy and Pudukottai area.

- > To control the percentage of migration.
- ➤ To encourage and promote Organic agricultural practices among the members

## 4.d. AGRICULTURAL TRAINING CENTRE (ATC)

The Agricultural Training Centre (ATC) was established by TMSSS during the year 1983 in a 75 acres of land at Nazareth in Pudukottai district. The purpose of establishment of the centre was to organize and conduct orientation, trainings and exposure programmes to equip and empower the small and marginal farmers and women headed farming families with modern and upto date knowledge and skills in the fields of agriculture and animal husbandry which are their traditional occupations and thereby enhance their employment, income, subsistence and sustainable living without further set back or dependence on others.

## 5. WOMEN WELFARE ACTIVITIES

## **5.a. SURABI - MAHALIR MEMBATTU IYAKKAM**

The Mahalir Mambattu Iyakkam (MMI) was established during the year 1987 and registered as a separate Society in the year 2009 under No: 274/2009 as SURABI Society for Development.

#### 5.d. FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE

In the present mechanical world there is an urgent need for family counselling to rescue the family system and norms of the society. Family counselling may be needed when there are hurt feelings, problems between the couple or another person in the family, new living environment, issues relating to the care of children and financial adjustments.

Relationship problems can arise at various stages of our lives. Keeping relationships on track is not always easy. Having a shaky moment does not mean your relationship is in trouble but it may be a sign that you could do with some help. Family counselling can guide and support couples to meet the challenges of life.

Family counselling can help maintain valued family relationships even after separation. At this time, parents need to focus on what is best for their children. Children will have feelings and emotions that they may not be able to understand or deal with.

A family counsellor can help adults, young people, couples and their children.

In TMSSS- Family couselling centre has been functioning at Keeranur, Pudukottai district since 1987 with the assistance of Central Social Welfare Board – New Delhi through the State Social Welfare Board – Chennai. Two full time professional counsellors render counselling and guidance to people who approach them in distress. Added to that the counsellors tie up with Free legal aid, ICDS and all women Police Station for dealing the family problems.
